The large expense of property Taxes for Nesika and Tyee went out in November.

...Board Meeting Minutes continued

Bliss Roofing payment went out on 11/30/21. Thought I had sent it out on 11/2/21 when I verified the amount and company with Sheryl but apparently I was mistaken. When Glen called me on 11/29, I checked my records and I never generated a check for it.

Mistake payment to my personal credit card account shows on the detailed reports on 11/12/21. The accounts are tied together since my name is on my US Bank REI credit card and the TCO checking account. When I made a payment to my personal credit card, I forgot to change the Pay From account box to my personal external checking account.

The TCO checking account is the default for payments since they are both held by US Bank. You will notice a deposit from my credit card to the TCO checking account immediately following the withdrawal.

Lots of membership deposits are coming into Paypal and the PO Box for 2022. Deposit detail shows the detailed member payments and is posted to the Drop Box.

Investment, Chris Monte reported

In the last couple of years, we decided to take more risk. Last March we made an investment. It did very well. Right now it doesn't make sense to invest more and are keeping the rest of the fund in a money market account.

2. Committee Reports

a. Nesika, Glen reported

The lodge is winterized. Nine people came in on a membership hike. You need to call the Forest Service if you're going to drive into the east side of Multnomah Creek. Trees are constantly on the road, so driving in without clearing is unlikely. We have enough wood for the winter. We need to haul the water inside in kettles. We'll probably have 50 or more trees to cut through when we drive in this spring. We received \$130 in general, unnamed donations for cots.

b. Tyee Lodge, Paul reported

In mid October Paul and a couple of others met with a Forest Service person about the trees around Tyee. They walked around the lodge, and he gave

verbal permission to take down 5 trees. Two of the trees are dead and away from structures so we could fell them. We can only use the part of trees that fall within 10 feet of the lodge, or within 5 feet of the road or trails for firewood. Two of them should probably be taken down professionally. The board approved doing the paper work to take down the 5 trees. We are allowed to push accumulated debris away from the lodge as a fire break.

We have a leaking valve that we will fix in the spring. For now, the turn off should be done out- side under the lean-to.

We had some water on the floor of the shop area. Paul dug a trench outside to funnel the water away from the building.

c. Membership - Lori absent

d. Publications - Joel reported

In August, Paypal raised their rates substantially. Stripe doesn't charge nearly as much and should let us do recurring, automatic dues payments. He will look into changing from PayPal to Stripe. If we decide to change, we will wait until February.

e. Trips - Crisse reported

We had a slow November with 2 membership hikes, 2 day hikes and 1 Tyee event. We discussed possible qualifications and a process for becoming a hike leader.

f. Social - Julia reported

She's looking forward to getting started in her position.

4. New Business

A. Assignment of an historian. We need to develop guidelines for the position. Any member who wants material to promote the club should be able to access it. Jennifer volunteered to draw up some ideas.

B. Outreach to members to get feedback. Joel can set up a survey to send out. We discussed possible questions.

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Reminders

For activities such as bicycle, snowshoe, and XC skiing check with the leaders for the difficulty level. Good equipment for the specific activity is required for all events. For hikes, snowshoes:

Class A - Shorter, less strenuous activity, typically 4 to 8 miles, less than 1500 feet elevation gain.

Class B - Moderate to difficult, typically 6 to 12 miles, up to 3000 feet of elevation gain.

Class C - Long and difficult, strong experienced participants only, typically over 8 miles, and over 3000 feet of elevation gain. Boots are recommended for B/C hikes.

Harsh or unusual conditions may greatly increase the exertion and skill required. Be prepared for the level of activity you are planning to take. Contact the trip leader if you have any questions and to let him or her know that you will be attending. Bring plenty of water and a sack lunch. Please, no alcohol. Remember to bring your Ten Essentials. Pets allowed on designated trips only.

Stay with the group and follow the leader. The leader is responsible for the group's safety. The leader determines which route is taken. The leader has authority to determine if a participant is prepared for the activity. Group safety must come first.

Fees

There is no charge to Trails Club members for day activities; non-members pay \$2. Please contribute to any carpooling expenses at the rate of \$.15 per mile. With multiple riders the driver can collect up to \$.30 per mile shared by all the riders. Other fees may apply.

If you have RSVP'd for an activity at a lodge involving food expense and are unable to participate, you are obligated to do one of the following: Cancel before the food is purchased, find someone to take your place, or pay for your share of the food.

All activities must be approved by the appropriate activity Coordinator or the Trips Trustee.
