Lines 15 and 20 show your estimated fee per participant using the <u>least</u> number of people you want on the outing.

Some outings may have room for many more than the minimum number of participants. That could greatly bring down the cost per person. You can <u>adjust your outing fees</u> with this in mind. However, we recommend using amounts somewhat closer to lines 15 and 20. This will bring in a little more money for your outing. Then all your expenses are more likely to be covered, even unexpected ones.
