




Be a leader!

- upkeep of benches, trim and doors


Next year the siding and interior of the dorm will be completed





Created a covered area outside the side door where the utilities access is. We will need to access this in snow time...







Updating the lodge!!


- we will start with insulating the upstairs dorms and likely creating two rooms (one room in each dorm) that will be a family bunk room or host room

- Downstairs fun...sauna in our future?





Treasurer's Report Nov 2021

- Club Funds at a Glance:
 - Fidelity end of Sept 2021: \$482,961.35
 - Columbia Threadneedle end of Sept 2021: \$49,658.66
 - Checkbook end of Oct 2021: \$20,369.01

Treasurer Report Trails Club of Oregon November 2021

- Fidelity Account balance is higher than last year at this time even with the \$30,000 drawn for yearly expenses in September.
- Lodge income is still quite low due to Covid.
 - Tyee has been rented in the summer for the ski school and planned to rent out again in June 2022. Summer 2021 income for this was \$1100.
 - Nesika dorm rebuild is mostly completed with just a few things to finish up. Expenses for this effort are still coming in. \$21,445.05 spent on the dorm rebuild in 2021.
 - Expenses not related to the rebuild are also slightly higher than 2020 due to the increased amount of activity to complete the dorm but still less than 2020 overall.
 - 2020 non-rebuild expenses: \$13,497.79
 - 2021 non-rebuild expenses: \$9,802.96
 - Property taxes for both Tyee and Nesika lodges are slightly higher than last year.
 - Tyee: \$1,974.49 compared to \$1,921.81 in 2020.
 - Nesika: \$3,113.48 compared to \$2,685.68 in 2020.
 - Insurance bills for both lodges not yet received.
- Admin/Publication expenses are down from last year.
- Overall income is lower than budgeted.
- Membership income is slightly higher than 2020.



And now for Bylaw amendments...

- a. Amendments to the Bylaws may be proposed by the Board of Trustees or by ten or more voting members.
- b.shall become effective upon the affirmative vote of 2/3rds of the voting members present and voting at a Club meeting.
- c.(2) Votes: bylaw changes for approval at the
- d.annual meeting
- e. The struck through words are the present bylaw language to be replaced by the words in bold.

Section 10. Trips Committee:

- (a) The Trips Committee shall plan and conduct oversee and support all hikes and outings of the Club, including regular hikes, backpacking, bicycling and winter sports activities, except those authorized by the Board of Trustees to be conducted by other committees.
- (b) It shall provide leaders for all its events.
- (c) The Committee shall prepare and submit for approval by the Board of Trustees a schedule of hikes and outings covering a period of three months and to be kept current on a three months' basis.

For trips and events to be official, they shall be placed on the Club's calendar.


The Board has the right to evaluate and approve the appropriateness of any activity or hike for safety, liability or other reasons and may remove any not deemed appropriate for the Club.

(d) It shall provide the Chair of the Publications Committee with a complete list of scheduled events for the coming month, together with all pertinent data concerning said events.

Leaders shall attempt to schedule trips and events on the Club's calendar by the 15th of each month so they may be published in the monthly Trail Blazer.

(e) The Chair shall obtain promptly from the leader of each scheduled event a complete report on the event, the revenues derived, completed guest cards, and such other information appropriate for reference.

The Treasurer shall obtain promptly from the leader of each scheduled event the revenues derived from the event. Trips reports and/or other information appropriate for reference may be submitted.
